St George's

Within the walls of a beautifully converted 200-year-old Georgian church, St George's, a 580-seat concert hall exudes a truly special ambiance. This historic venue serves as a haven for some of Britain's finest performances.

Thought to be the oldest public park in the country, Brandon Hill is an enchanting area featuring sweeping views of Bristol, the perfect picnic spot. Plus, set amongst a beautiful nature reserve, you can ascend the 32-metre historic Cabot Tower for a full 360 view of Bristol's landscape.





Housed within a Grade 2 listed building and recently undergoing a remarkable renovation, the Royal West of England Academy has preserved its rich heritage while embracing contemporary ideas. Providing an extensive programme of exhibitions, events, workshops, talks, and lectures to the public.

Boasting nineteen galleries spread across three floors, this institution captivates visitors with its diverse collection of art and historical artefacts. The museum is always free to enter and the art gallery regularly hosts an exciting array of events and exhibitions.
